Field Study in Berlin

16 + 17 AUG 2014







We will take you on a weekend excursion to Berlin, Germany's bustling capital city.

The excursion includes:

- a field study of urban multilingualism and linguistic cityscapes (obligatory)
- a guided tour of the parliament (Reichstag)



Shopping

Shops in the city centre are usually open between 9/10 a.m. and 6/7 p.m. Bakeries usually open at around 6/7 a.m. Most supermarkets open at 8 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. The nearest supermarket is called "Nah & Frisch", located at Rotgerberstr. (Dompassage shopping centre). Supermarkets, shops and institutions are closed on Sunday, so you will need to plan ahead.

Transportation

Generally all the locations (youth hostel, classes, lunch) are within walking distance. In case you need a ride:

* Bus fare: EUR 1.90

* Taxis can be found especially at the market square and at the train station.

* Train station: the train station is adjacent to the city centre and within walking distance.
